“Where Would We BEE Without Pollinators?”

The AFCD Poster Contest is open to kindergarten through twelfth grade students. Artwork entered into the State Competition must have been judged at an Area Meeting poster contest.

Contest Rules

- Only digital posters (photographs or scanned copies of the hand drawn posters) will be accepted. Photographs must be clear and well framed.
- Any media may be used, including paint, crayon, colored pencil, charcoal, stickers, paper, or other materials.
- All posters must be created by an individual student, rather than a team of students. Entry must be contestant’s original creation and may not be traced from photographs or other artist’ published works.
- The 2020 Stewardship theme “Where Would We BEE Without Pollinators?” must be included on the front side of each poster submission to be eligible for the state poster contest.
- Each entry for the state contest must be submitted to AFCD with a local to state entry form to be eligible for judging. The form must be completed and signed by a parent or guardian.
- Although younger students will most likely receive help in planning from parents or teachers, AFCD encourages each student to do their own work. Note: entries with student handwriting and coloring will score better than those designed, drawn, and colored by adult assistance.

- 50% Conservation message (Poster uses correct theme)
- 30% Visual effectiveness
- 10% Originality
- 10% Universal appeal
